MOKA is a nearly complete 4,400 sqft communal space to meet, reflect, learn and create. It is a place to dream! The first floor will be gathering space and an art gallery, the second floor will be a visual arts and education studio, the third floor will serve as visiting artists' residences, and the fourth floor will be occupied by Mobuto and Charlotte (the owners). MOKA will develop exhibitions, studio practices, artist presentations, cultural exchanges, artist residences and art classes. The Gallery will provide a space for artists, culture workers, and musicians to share their expertise with the Hill District community.
