

Greater Hill District Master Plan Process

What is going on?

Pittsburgh's Dept. of City Planning is seeking resident engagement and feedback on the adoption of our neighborhood master plan so that, when finished, it will be incorporated into the City's municipal code.

How did we get here?

Since 2017, the Hill CDC has advocated for the adoption of the GHDMP. This required the Plan to be updated and reorganized to match the City's code requirements. The aspirations of the Community's 2011 Plan remain, taking into consideration the progress made since that time.

How can I get involved?
